

## Once in a Lifetime Iceland Trek Seeking two Adventurers

June 24 [Halifax] – Two lucky adventurers have an opportunity to join the trip of a lifetime to the wilds of Iceland. The Nova Scotia Nature Trust announced today that two coveted positions have opened on the Nature Trust’s **Expedition for Earth 2016** to Iceland.

An enthusiastic team of Nova Scotians is heading to Iceland for a 7 day guided journey through the Fjallabak Nature Reserve, from September 8-15<sup>th</sup>. Participants will experience spectacular volcanic landscapes, inviting hot springs, moss-covered lava fields and steam-filled valleys of this remote and stunning wilderness area. Each **Expedition for the Earth** participant is also raising awareness and funds to protect wilderness here in their own backyard in Nova Scotia.

Now two more people have the opportunity to be a part of this unique adventure.

“One couple who’d hoped to celebrate their honeymoon on the Expedition had to withdraw unexpectedly today because of an injury,” explained the Nature Trust’s Event Coordinator Magali Gregoire. “So, we have two openings for participants. For everyone who thought they’d missed out on this incredible experience—it’s not too late!”



This bucket-list trip is accessible to a wide range of people and previous trekking or international travel experience is not necessary. The trip follows the Nature Trust’s highly successful inaugural **Expedition for the Earth** in 2013 to Patagonia, Chile. This expedition raised over \$70,000 for conservation in Nova Scotia and all participants were delighted with their experience. In fact four expedition members from the inaugural trip are also joining the Iceland adventure.



Laura Hussey-Bondt is excited to be part of the team once again. “An adventure like this reawakens your soul, and

reminds us all of the wonder and significance of wild, natural places,” says Hussey-Bondt. Hussey-Bondt is joined by other Patagonia Expedition alumni, Henry Fuller, Rene and Ted Scrutton.

Among the new team members is Andrew Taillon. "I've always admired the work that the Nature Trust has done, and also always wanted to hike in Iceland," said Taillon. "This is an amazing opportunity to help the Nature Trust and meet a personal goal too."

The trip will be expertly guided by internationally renowned adventurer and mountaineer Wally Berg, of Berg Adventures International, whose track record in adventure includes summiting and guiding all of the world's highest peaks including Mount Everest, and countless international treks. Berg truly loves adventure and bringing the power and magic of adventure to his clients.

"I am thrilled to work with the Nature Trust once again! Iceland is the ultimate adventure landscape for lovers of the natural world. Geysers, glaciers, wildlife, coasts and mountains abound. Human history on the island is rich and fascinating, but is always set against the power and beauty of nature," says Berg.
